# **Live Performance Critique**

Students must attend a live music performance and write a critique. This means a performance with musicians singing or playing instruments – not a recorded performance or "live" recorded/streamed performance. Events viewed on television, YouTube, DVDs, or videos do not qualify as a live music performance.

#### Examples of performances that you could write a critique on:

- Instrumental Music Concert Any level (elementary, middle school, high school, college, community group, or professional)
- Musical Must have a live pit orchestra, not a recording/CD
- Choral Concert Any level (elementary, middle school, high school, college, community group, or professional)
- · Rock, Jazz, Hip-Hop, or Pop Concert
- Ballet Must have a pit orchestra, not a recording/CD

If you are not sure a performance will qualify, please ask Mr. Loney ahead of time.

#### Guidelines for writing your critique

- 1. Use appropriate, high school level writing.
- 2. The report should be at least three-pages, typed, and double-spaced.
- 3. Critique must have a title page & report cover. (5 Points)
- 4. Must attach program and/or ticket stub from the performance. (5 Points)
- 5. The critique must be written about a performance that took place during the semester in which you are submitting it.
- 6. You may not write a critique on a performance that you performed in.
- 7. Late critiques will not be accepted.
